ACQUITTAL PROCESS - FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

The following information provides answers to questions with regards to the GCG acquittal. They don't provide answers for every possible scenario, but general information to address common questions. Any questions you may still have should be, in the first instance, addressed to your State or Territory contact.

Our association has only managed to get a 2 teams for their competition?

In this situation, the association has not met one of the fundamental GCG funding guidelines. Having only two teams doesn't constitute a competition, and unless there are exceptional circumstances, the association will be asked to return the funding.

We have combined with another association to run one competition, do we both have to do the acquittal?

Yes, both Association will need to complete the acquittal process. If the acquittal is successful, neither Association will receive any further funding as they have received a total of \$5k. If the acquittal is successful and only one association has been paid, the remaining \$2.5k will be paid to the appropriate association.

We've combined with two other clubs to get a team for a competition. What is the acquittal process for us?

All clubs will need to complete the acquittal process with the relevant State or Territory providing clarification. This will then be reviewed and an outcome and course of action decided.

We won't be able to attend an ASFA workshop until after 30 March 2017, what happens?

States and Territories will be working with funding recipients who haven't yet attended an ASFA workshop and provide information on their nearest workshop. The workshop will be run where required to accommodate need. We encourage associations, clubs and schools to contact their State or Territory as soon as possible, and book into a workshop.

Our club doesn't have a MILO in2CRICKET or MILO T20 Blast centre, but we participate in our local Association run program; is this acceptable?

Yes.

Our association hasn't met the number of teams we forecast in our application; what happens?

This is disappointing, however each competition must have a minimum of 4 teams and have run at least a 4 week competition. If you have achieved this, you have met the funding conditions.

The scores of our competition are not available on MyCricket.

Associations and clubs need to load competition scores on to MyCricket as this is a funding requirement. If an association or club completes the online acquittal form, and haven't put scores on MyCricket, their acquittal will be reviewed further and they risk not receiving their second 50% payment.

A member protection officer course was not available in my State or Territory. We have a State or Territory approved policy in place; does this meet requirements?

Yes, this is acceptable and meets requirements.

Our club doesn't have a currently accredited Community Coach.

Clubs are required to have a currently accredited Community Coach as part of the funding conditions. The Cricket Coaches Australia website has a list of courses available here. There is funding available for females, and those from multicultural and indigenous backgrounds to complete the course free of charge. Please contact your State or Territory Coach Development Manager for more information.

What happens if the association, club or school needs an extension?

Requests for extensions need to be submitted to Cricket Australia as soon as possible. An email should be sent to community@cricket.com.au with specific details to explain why an extension is requested and the date the extension is requested to.
